

“The Good Shepherd and the Final Exodus” (Zechariah 10)

Big Idea: The Lord’s flock can depend on their Good Shepherd.

- I. The Text’s Message Unfolded in Context
 - a. Look to the true Shepherd to hear and sustain his flock. (verses 1–2)

Hosea 2:8
 - b. Look to the chief Shepherd to rule and exalt his flock. (verses 3–5)

Ezekiel 34:17–24; Zechariah 12:1–9
 - c. Look to the strong Shepherd to gather and multiply his flock. (verses 6–12)

Zechariah 2:6–12; 9:6–7; Psalm 87:1–6; Isaiah 11:10–16; Isaiah 43:1–7
- II. The Text’s Message Understood in Christ
 - a. Look to Jesus as the good and great shepherd of God’s flock.

John 10:11–18
 - b. Look to Jesus as the warrior king of Judah.

2 Samuel 1:22–23; Psalm 45:4–7; Revelation 6:2; 1 Corinthians 15:25–26
 - c. Look to Jesus as the stability of his house.

Ephesians 2:19–22; Acts 4:8–13; 1 Peter 2:4–8; Isaiah 22:20–25; Rev. 3:7–8
 - d. Look to Jesus as the savior greater than Moses.

Exodus 19:2b–6; Revelation 1:5b–6
 - e. Look to Jesus as the true God and giver of every good thing.
