

“The King Rides Forth” (Zechariah 9)

Big Idea: Zion shall find final victory in her humble Prince of Peace.

- I. Zion’s pagan neighbors shall be subdued before the Lord. (verses 1–8)
 - a. Destruction from the Lord’s Hand (verses 1–6)
 - b. Inclusion with the Lord’s People (verse 7)

 - c. Security for the Lord’s House (verse 8)
- II. Zion’s humble king shall speak peace to the nations. (verses 9–10)
 - a. The Humble Arrival of a Righteous King and Savior (verse 9)

Matthew 21:1–11; John 12:12–18
 - b. The Worldwide Peace by His Words and Reign (verse 10)

Isaiah 42:1–7; Ephesians 2:11–18; Psalm 72:1, 7–11, 17
- III. Zion’s captive people shall prosper in the Lord’s warfare. (verses 11–17)
 - a. A Release by the Covenant Blood (verses 11–12)
 - b. A Victory both Joyful and Bloody (verses 13–15)
