<p><i>What three events caution us from extrapolating the present into the past?</i> Fall, fiat, and flood.</p> <p>What is biblical creation? God created the world by fiat—<i>ex nihilo</i>.</p> <p>Man</p>  <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Death is after</i> the Fall!</p> <p>What is theistic evolution? God created the world by evolution—<i>it's not true!</i></p>  <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Death is before</i> man!</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Man</p>	<p><i>What are the four principal parts of a verb?</i> Present, past, present participle, and past participle. <i>What is an example of the four principal parts?</i> Sink, sank, sinking, sunk.</p> <p>What does an adjective do? An adjective modifies a noun or a pronoun.</p> <p>What questions does an adjective answer? <i>How many? Whose? Which one? What kind?</i></p> <p>For older students: What are the two article adjectives? The definite article <i>the</i> and the indefinite article <i>a/an</i>.</p>

<p>On what truth did God evaluate Eli and his sons? “Those who honor Me I will honor, and those who despise Me will be lightly esteemed.” —1 Samuel 2:30</p> <p>How did Samuel, as a boy, respond to God? “Speak, LORD, for Your servant is listening.” —1 Samuel 3:9</p> <p>For older students: On what truth did Jonathan face the Philistines? “Come and let us cross over to the garrison... perhaps the LORD will work for us, for the LORD is not restrained to save by many or by few.” —1 Samuel 14:6</p> <p>On what truth did David qualify as the next king? “Man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart.” —1 Samuel 16:7</p> <p>Bonus: Psalm 23 The bonus passage can simply be read or sung. It is recommended that children <i>first</i> learn the psalm. The hymn is an enjoyable way to reinforce the psalm.</p>	<p><i>What proverb reminds us of the ultimate proof?</i> Wisdom is vindicated by all her children. <i>What proverb expresses our attitude in isolation?</i> Let God be true and every man a liar. <i>What proverb expresses our hope for obedience?</i> What is impossible for men is possible for God. —Matthew 19:26</p> <p>What proverb expresses our attitude about today? Each day has enough trouble of its own. —Matthew 6:34</p>

<p><i>What are the properties of addition and multiplication?</i> Commutative, associative, and distributive.</p> <p><i>What are the parts in the mathematical operations?</i> Addition: <i>Addend + Addend = Sum</i> Subtraction: <i>Minuend – Subtrahend = Difference</i> Multiplication: <i>Factor × Factor = Product</i> Division: <i>Dividend ÷ Divisor = Quotient</i> Exponentiation: <i>Base raised to a Power (Exponent)</i></p> <p>What is a saying for the order operations? Please Excuse My Dear Aunt Sally.</p> <p>What is the order of operations? Parentheses Exponents Multiplication and Division Addition and Subtraction</p>	<p><i>What are the main things inside the cell?</i> Cell membrane and maybe a cell wall, cytoplasm, cytosol, organelles, and a nucleus.</p> <p>What are the four cellular processes? <i>Metabolism</i> – to build up and break down <i>Photosynthesis</i> – to build up <i>sugar</i> <i>Glycolysis</i> – to break down <i>sugar</i> <i>Decomposition</i> – to decay</p> <p>For older students: What are the two kinds of cellular division? <i>Mitosis</i> with <i>all</i> the information for growing, and <i>Meiosis</i> with <i>half</i> the information for mating.</p> <p>Bonus: What are the eleven body systems? Skeletal, Muscular, Nervous, Digestive; Respiratory, Urinary, Endocrine, Lymphatic; Cardiovascular and Reproductive; And finally, over all, Integumentary.</p>

<p><i>What are the New England states and their capitals?</i> Augusta, Maine; Concord, New Hampshire; Montpelier, Vermont; Boston, Massachusetts; Hartford, Connecticut; Providence, Rhode Island.</p> <p>The Mid-Atlantic States and Capitals</p>  <p>For older students: What are the five boroughs of New York City? The Bronx, Brooklyn, Manhattan, Queens, and Staten Island.</p>	<p>American History Timeline Washington, Jefferson, Adams, and Franklin, Lexington, Minute Men, Trenton, and Yorktown, Hamilton, Madison, Jay finally winning: Separate powers with checks against sinning. No state religion—no sword for the church. Baptists grow mighty; the Methodists start: Religion now wins America’s heart.</p> <p>Who wrote in favor of the U. S. Constitution? Alexander Hamilton and James Madison.</p> <p>For older students:</p> <p>Who is Alexander Hamilton? The New York revolutionary and first secretary of the treasury, who wrote most of the <i>Federalist Papers</i> and died in a duel.</p> <p>Who is James Madison? The “father of the constitution” and fourth president of the USA, who said, “If men were angels, government would be unnecessary.”</p>
