TRUST HISTORY'S SOVEREIGN

ANTIOCHUS IV 175 – 164 BC

- *Daniel 11:21–24* — Antiochus will rise to power.
- *Daniel 11:25–31* — Antiochus will treat God's people and God's temple abominably but only for the duration of time that God has determined.
- *Daniel 11:32–35* — God's people will faithfully endure and boldly resist Antiochus.

WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT “THE TIME OF THE END”

1. Know that God will allow Antichrist to rise to power for a time (Daniel 11:36–39).

“[The man of lawlessness...the man doomed to destruction] will oppose and will exalt himself over everything that is called God or is worshiped, so that he sets himself up in God's temple, proclaiming himself to be God.”

3. Know that God will raise to life all who’ve died—to everlasting life or to everlasting shame (12:1–4).
4. Know that God will bring all that he’s predicted to pass—so die with solid confidence (12:5–13).

THE MAIN POINT OF DANIEL 11:36–12:13

God controls history's end, including its climactic turmoil and its arrival at everlasting justice. So, believer, endure to the end—no matter how hard.
