<p>What is the priority of love in your behavior? “Let all that you do be done in love.” —1 Corinthians 16:14</p> <p>What is one test of the sincerity of our love? “Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil; cling to what is good.” —Romans 12:9</p> <p>Note: The sincerity of love is felt deeply in our affections—in what attracts or repels us (cf. Mt. 6:24). <i>Romans 12:9ff is the other “love chapter”!</i></p> <p>What are characteristics of love in the love chapter? “Love is patient, love is kind and is not jealous; love does not brag and is not arrogant, does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own, is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong suffered, does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails...” —1 Corinthians 13:4-8a</p> <p>Note: A list of what love produces, not a definition.</p> <p>The “Bonus” passages summarize the gospel message:</p> <p>The Romans Road Romans 3:23 6:23 5:8 10:9-10 8:1</p> <p>Note: Christ’s resurrection and lordship means He is alive to hear us and has authority to save us (10:9-10)!</p>	<p>The teacher should memorize the introduction and quote it with <i>lively emphasis</i>, while looking the students one by one in the eye.</p> <p>Memorize: Do not bear false witness. Do not say, “A tit for tat, I’ll pay him back.” —from Proverbs 24:28-29</p> <p>The <i>saying</i> should be memorized, but not the reference. Show the picture (see the document of thirty pictures).</p> <p>Note: It is common for children to get even by bearing false witness against the one, who harmed them. In other words, we lie to get even with someone else.</p> <p>This saying illustrates how one sin leads to another sin.</p> <p>May the Lord grant us repentance right away, lest our sins take us away!</p> <p>Additional Note: At this point in the school year, it would be wise for the parent or the teacher to reflect on these thirty words as God’s choice of topics for a child.</p> <p>Carefully catalog God’s topics and assess how well your regular admonitions include these topics.</p> <p>May God bless each of us in encouraging our children well according to the topics God has given us. Amen!</p>
