we shall come rejoicing, bringing in the sheaves.

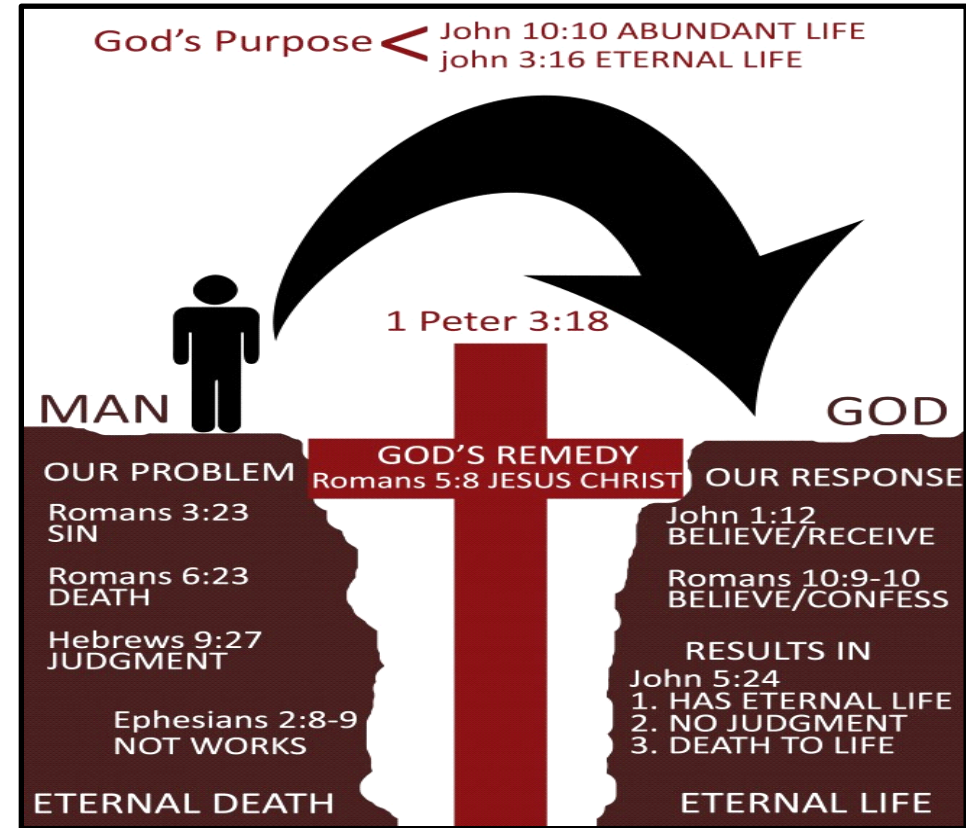

Jesus Called Peter (2)
Luke 5:1–11

The gospel of Luke gives us details about how Jesus called Peter into ministry.

v. 1–3 - Peter was involved with his fishing business.

- Jesus continued ministering the word to people.
- People wanted to be near Jesus to hear the word of God from Him.
- Jesus taught that although there is weeping now, in the kingdom there will be a bountiful harvest that God will provide to His people - **Psalm 126**
Going forth with weeping, sowing for the Master,
though the loss sustained our spirit often grieves;

we shall come rejoicing, bringing in the sheaves. [Refrain]

Galatians 6:9 And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart.
- Peter had been with Jesus for up to six months listening to His preaching and watching Him perform miracles (John 1–4).
- Jesus had already taught Peter about sowing and reaping - **John 4:34–38**
- Peter was still a fisherman of fish.

v. 4–5 - Peter was willing to obey Jesus.

- Jesus was in Peter's boat because He was speaking to Him personally.
- Peter knew enough about Jesus to obey Him, even if it didn't make sense.

v. 6–10 - Peter surrendered His life to Jesus.

- Jesus demonstrated His power to accomplish what His word promised.
- Jesus showed Peter that He could do a work for him beyond his ability.
- Peter was humbled over his unworthiness. The Lord does not need nor does He have to use us.
- Peter was broken over his inadequacies. The Lord does not have to bless our work.
- Peter learned that the Lord desires to use humble and broken servants.
- Jesus taught Peter that He would give to Peter more blessing than he could ever deserve or earn - **John 4:38 I sent you to reap that for which you have not labored;**
- Peter was called to be a fisherman of people.

Luke 5:11 So when they had brought their boats to land, they forsook all and followed Him.

- The Lord is doing a personal work in each of our lives to bring us to a full surrender to Him.
- When we are surrendered to the Lord, we don't live to "catch fish," we catch men.
